AGENDA

I. Welcome and IntroductionsRyan Costella
Chair, Manufacturing Sector Council

Mr. Ryan Costella, Chair of the Manufacturing Sector Council, introduced himself and welcomed the Council and everyone with a “Happy New Year” greeting. This meeting was called to order by Chair, Mr. Ryan Costella at 10:00 a.m. and asked for roll to be called.

II. Roll call and Establishment of a QuorumDerita Hopkins
Administrative Assistant, Workforce Solutions Unit, DETR

Derita Hopkins called roll and it was established that a quorum was present.

III. Verification of Posting.....Derita Hopkins

Ms. Hopkins verified the meeting agenda was posted in accordance with the Nevada Revised Statute – NRS 241.020 at locations throughout the State of Nevada.

IV. **First Public Comment Session**Ryan Costella
Members of the public will be invited to speak before; however, no action may be taken on a matter during public comment until the matter itself has been included on an agenda as an item for possible action. Public comment may be limited to three minutes per person at the discretion of the chairperson.

For the first public comment session, Mr. Costella invited members of the public to speak, stating any member of the public may now comment on any matter posted on this meeting agenda. He advised that the comments may be limited to three minutes at his discretion as the Council Chair. Mr. Costella requested for anyone to speak from Las Vegas and anyone from Reno, Nevada. Hearing none, Mr. Costella turned to the next agenda item #V.

V. ***Discussion/Possible Action** – Approval of the November 19, 2012, Meeting Minutes
..... Ryan Costella

Mr. Costella asked for approval of the November 19, 2012, Meeting Minutes. Mr. David Ching Lee wished to be abstained from voting, because he was not at the last meeting. A suggestion was presented to make corrections, because Pedro Martinez was listed as both a “board member” and “guest.” It was agreed by the Council that Pedro Martinez should only be listed as a “board member.” It was noted that the item will be corrected. A motion was made by the Chair, Ryan Costella to approve the minutes with the noted corrections. This motion was seconded by Mr. Frederick Cook, “ALL” in favor and none opposed. Motion carried.

VI. ***Discussion/Possible Action** – Approval of the October 8, 2012, Meeting Minutes
.....Ryan Costella

Mr. Costella asked for approval of the October 8, 2012, Meeting Minutes. Again, Mr. David Ching Lee wished to be abstained from voting, because he was not at the last meeting. A motion was made by the Chair, Ryan Costella for approval of meeting minutes. This motion was seconded by both Mr. Frederick Cook and Commissioner Gerri Schroder, “ALL” in favor and none opposed. Motion carried.

VII. ***Discussion/Possible Action** – New Council Member Review/Update.....Ryan Costella

Mr. Costella invited sector council members to feel free at every meeting to suggest new members and/or new companies that we may want to engage to build the private sector representation on this sector council; therefore, Mr. Costella invited members to participate in that effort. Mr. Costella requested for Perry Ursem to provide updates regarding the “Clearwater Paper” (a paper manufacturing company). Mr. Ursem introduced himself as the Industry Specialist for the Governor’s Office of Economic Development.

Mr. Ursem informed the Council that they are reviewing a couple of companies right now; the first one is "Clearwater Paper," a paper manufacturer company located in the North Las Vegas area. He is talking to the plant manager, Gary Blosl and he is currently in the process, right now of finishing the paperwork to become a member of the Manufacturer's Sector Council Board. There is a meeting scheduled a week from Wednesday (January 16, 2013) to meet with the Varian Medical Systems. The Varian Medical Systems are an "X-Ray" component manufacturer based in the Las Vegas Valley, and he is talking to Dr. William Reed in his election to participate on their Board as well. In addition, Mr. Ursem noted that there are other companies that he's talking to at this time; however, nothing confirmed just yet. He will have additional information to present to the Council as that comes along.

Mr. Costella acknowledged the newest member of the manufacturing sector council, Mr. David Ching Lee. Mr. David Ching Lee introduced himself to the Council and noted that his most significant background was centered on the Clark County Air Quality Management for 30 years. He was in charge of the Permit Section; and in that regards, he gained the experience of permitting "major" manufacturing facilities in Clark County. There are approximately hundreds of them or more. Every major facility has to have a piece of fuel burning equipment; if not just for heating the factory. Some of the facilities process for heavy use of thermal energy; therefore, he has obtained a good collection of 10-20 years in this work area.

Mr. Costella welcomed David Ching Lee to the Manufacturing Sector Council and reiterated on the meeting topic #VI about new sector council members. Mr. Costella invited him to provide any suggestions on "folks" (individuals) he may want to reach out to and invite them to attend any future sector council meetings.

Ray Bacon informed the sector council members go back and review the initial sheet of companies that Mr. Bill Anderson (Chief Economist for the State of Nevada) provided at the first meeting. He noted that if you take a look at the sectors that are involved; outlined is where a vast majority of our employment comes from in Nevada. There are numerous employment sectors that we do not; for example, we are not going to have a steel mill here; therefore, consequently you can take that right off the list completely. He noted to the Council, if you go through the sectors that tend to match where our national growth is and where our existing jobs are, there's probably three for sure that fall into that category, but potentially four from that category; we need to at least take a look at and just kind of conduct a walk-through review. He informed the Council; currently we do not have anyone at this stage of the game that can represent the **Gaming Equipment/Gaming Supply Workforce Sector**. Mr. Bacon noted that there are a lot of companies listed; that are somewhat unique to this State, a major source of employment, which is not going to go away. Mr. Bacon provided his opinion that *"it doesn't matter whether it's...who it is, but we should at least take a look at those companies and consider adding somebody there to participate with the manufacturing industry sector."*

Mr. Frederick Cook (Chief Executive Officer of the Cole Kepro International, LLC) informed the Council that he has represented the Slot Machine Manufacturing Company, who manufacturer slot machines for most of those gaming companies mentioned previously by Ray Bacon. Therefore, both the Gaming Sector and the Manufacturing Sector are well represented. In addition, Mr. Cook stated *"of course, we're not IGT, but they are more of financial companies, we are the manufacturers instead."* Mr. Bacon agreed, but informed the Council that the problem exists with the "job growth" in the Gaming Industry Sector would be focus more on the software and firmware side of the operation. He doesn't think from a manufacturing stand point that they will get involved. Mr. Cook agreed, only ship out of state, but from the manufacturing standpoint and not the software standpoint. Mr. Bacon suggested for the sector council to take a look at one of the things which we have a problem with in this State, for example the STEM jobs, and a lot of that involves the software, the firmware, the development of the new games and those kind of job sectors content. He suggested for the Council to discuss on appointing someone from that segment to provide more helpful insight. Mr. Cook volunteered to provide a couple of suggestions; if the sector council would like to focus in that area.

Mr. Bacon asked for the sector council to look at the national data (Ryan received that morning), foods is still a growing marketplace and it's probably not going to go away. He noted that the Food Industry will continue to grow in Nevada, because of the AB32 issue in California. There are relatively close margin items in the food industry and they tend to be high towards energy users. Therefore, the food industry is going to be a growing market. He noted that there are probably twenty companies out there at least, both North America and South America; for example, you have Starbucks, SK, BRP and NOW Foods and food items more similar to that end. He advised the Council, if you remove the Interstate Brands out; you will still probably have another dozen, or so down that end of the State. He advised the Council to need focus at providing a representative from this workforce sector. He noted that another one to focus on; which is noticeably absent is Plastics. We have a lot of Plastics manufacturing companies, whether we're talking extruders, machinery, molders and/or whatever in this state, or filmmakers and people that do the plastic bag material-type of jobs. We may want to take a look and say, "who" do we want to address in that sector? It's clearly a Regional and National Growth, if you go back to the graduate plastics; invest in plastics because it's probably not going to go away anytime soon. He mentioned, finally, the last one will be Printers. We have everything that can perform "High-Volume," news print type inserts, to all kinds of high-end printers in the Southern Nevada Region, and high-end printers in the Northern Nevada; printing is an industry that is undergoing dramatic change and has undergone dramatic change for the past twenty years. Mr. Bacon mentioned his discussion over 15 years ago with the Plant Manager at Donnelly when their plan was running at 700 employees; if you were using the technology when he was a printer in college; that company would have had approximately 4,000 employees. So, it's already undergone dramatic change. It's probably going to undergo additional changes and the sector council may want to designate someone; at least think on the leading edge to support this industry.

Perry Ursem thanked Ray Bacon for bringing some of the much needed development to the table for discussion right now. He noted, in terms of food the manufacturer Ocean Spray and others have a large presence here in the Southern Nevada area. He mentioned, with respect to the Plastics manufacturing we are currently pursuing the Berry Plastics Company. In addition, with regards to the Printing manufacturing we are currently pursuing the Creel Printing Company for their insight. Again, Mr. Ursem thanked Ray Bacon for the "excellent" recommendations, and confirmed that the manufacturing sector council is actively chasing those suggested areas. Bacon closing remarks were that the sector council is fairly heavy with the industry representation for the Southern Nevada sector; that we focus on balancing with individuals in the Northern Nevada sector; there are lots of opportunities at either end of the State in all of these sectors.

Councilwoman Gerri Schroder informed the Council in regards to Berry Plastics and Poly-West; that she's currently working with Poly-West in the Railroad Industry and some residents right now on some other kind of issues. Also, we recently had prior meetings through the City of Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce with Berry Plastics on their manufacturing company and she will be happy to assist with those areas of focus, if needed.

Mr. Costella (Chair) thanked Councilwoman Gerri Schroder for volunteering her expertise in that area. Mr. Costella requested for any additional updates or review on new council members review or comments (meeting topic #VII) to discuss further from Las Vegas Site? No reply. Again, Mr. Costella requested for any comments on this topic from the Reno Site? No reply. Leandra Copeland (Economist for DETR Research & Analysis Bureau) requested for the sector council to provide some sort of handout, flyer or brochure that would present a broad overview of the Manufacturing Sector Council. This would be a helpful tool to provide to new members and anyone who may be interested in serving on the manufacturing sector council. Mr. Costella suggested for Leandra to contact LeVerne Kelley for this sort of information.

Earl McDowell (DETR – Deputy Administrator for the Workforce Solution Unit) informed the Council that DETR is currently in the process of putting together some brochures; and including sector council's overview information on the DETR website. He noted that providing brochures for each Sector Council is one of the major things DETR Workforce Solution Unit will implement during the first quarter of this New Year. Mr. McDowell pointed out that Mae Worthey – DETR Public Information Officer will be the

individual who is going to be putting this information together for each GWIB Sector Councils. Also, each GWIB Sector Council will be on the DETR Website which you will be able to link additional information, such as, upcoming meeting dates, etc. He informed the Council that the GWIB Sector Councils website link will be provided for the public to view as well.

VIII. ***Discussion/Possible Action** – Review of “draft” report to Director Woodbeck.....Ryan Costella

Mr. Costella thanked everyone for their participation in the Director Woodbeck survey that was focus on the Manufacturing Sector Council industry needs and allowing everyone to provide some perspectives on what the manufacturing skills needs are? What kind of credentials or training we need provide? A draft memorandum was produced from with the combined data received from sector council members. This memorandum will be forward to Director Woodbeck to provide him with outlook of what we are facing within the manufacturing arena on the “Economy” perspective and the state of certainty with respect to regulation. The memorandum will present what we are looking at in terms of our workforce needs, in the short term, the medium term and the long term. He noted that the information received back from each member really echoed what the national data is showing. Mr. Costella requested for any additional suggestion from the sector council members. Ray Bacon suggested to the Council to add the one-liner that you focus more on and constant contact with manufactured goods. He noted that the vast majority of us, we can never think of a point in time, when we were not in physical contact with manufactured goods. He suggested for the Council to make this connection to provide insight regarding manufactured goods is basically everything we use and operate. Councilwoman Gerri Schroder suggested to the Council to add something when advertising manufacturing jobs examples; like the iPhones, iPads, electronic games, etc., to help promote interest for the new generation.

Mr. Costella thanked everyone for their helpful suggestions and mentioned after he makes a couple of adjustments to the draft memorandum; he will formally forward it on to DETR Director Woodbeck and the Governor’s Workforce Investment Board Members.

IX. ***Discussion/Possible Action** – GWIB visit to Career Academics in Las Vegas.....Ryan Costella

Mr. Costella asked for everyone thoughts on the recent presentation from Felicia Nemeck (Southwest Career and Technical Academy). Mr. Costella advised the sector council to recommend this group and try to make an effort to visit some of those institutions to view some of the work sector possibilities for today. LeVerne Kelley (DETR ESD Specialist III) commented that she spoke with her in November 2012 and she was willing to host a meeting to accommodate our needs, if we like to have a meeting and/or a tour. Mr. Costella agreed, and also recommended that the sector council, Director Woodbeck and Governor Brian Sandoval also try to make an effort to visit those schools; perhaps consider hosting a meeting at one of the institutes would be a great idea for the manufacturer sector council members who may have never attended and/or tour their schools.

Mr. David McElwain (Coordinator CTE, Clark County School District) as CCSD liaison, volunteered to be a point of contact person to arrange all of the future tours since he’s in direct contact with the schools principals and community partnership coordinators. He suggested that the sector council not only visit the Career Academies, but model now into the comprehensive High Schools. He suggested that the sector council add the manufacturing program with two comprehensive High Schools. .

X. ***Presentation and Discussion/Possible Action** – Dream It Do It.....Jonathan Begley
Executive Director, Dream It Do It

Does the Council want to point the GWIB to this report and endorse “Dream It Do It” as the Manufacturing Industry’s attempt to engage proactively with schools, parents, teachers, students, etc. through both tangible outreach, tours, etc. and paid marketing and advertising...Ryan Costella

Mr. Costella introduced to the sector council Mr. Jonathan Begley, who serves as the Executive Director of the “*Dream It, Do It Nevada*” which has been created by a strong group of manufacturers to really try

and combat this perception from the industry’s platform. Mr. Costella invited Jonathan Begley to provide a brief overview of the “Dream It, Do It Nevada” organization.

Jonathan Begley referenced the handout packet received to review the reports that were done by The Manufacturing Institute and Deloitte. Upon review of the reports, Mr. Begley pointed out there’s a problem present here in Nevada, but this is not something that is new. The reports shows studies that have been conducted year after year and the perception problem that Congresswoman Gerri Schroder had mentioned is something that’s a critical issue facing the manufacturing sector at this time. There are a couple of noticeable statistics from the reports; (1) 86 percent of Americans recognize the importance of manufacturing to a stable economy; and (2) 80 percent believe that manufacturing and our emphasis on manufacturing should be a national priority; however, as a career choice, manufacturing comes in at the very bottom amongst key industries. Mr. Begley believes the reason for this result is solely based on a perception problem. People don not understand what manufacturing concept is. And people do not understand that manufacturing is very prevalent here in Nevada. There are so many different types of opportunities to do what you love and to build what you love. We really need to get the message out to interest our youth in Nevada. Dream It Do It Nevada was a campaign that was created by the Manufacturing Institute to kind of confront this issue. Again, help people understand that the manufacturing industry is not low skills, low wages and dirty jobs, but rather opportunities for advanced manufacturing careers with very high skills and very much in demand for these accessible careers.

“Dream It Do it Nevada” place is currently in place in more than twenty-five states in different fashions. Most states have had somewhat ineffective results, primarily because it’s a government institution or an educational institution that is trying to push this at manufacturers. Nevada is really trying to take a different approach; as Ryan Costella mentioned there’s a small strong group of manufacturers stepping up to actively engage through the “Dream It Do It Nevada” concept to inform our youth, our transitioning workers, our parents and our teachers what those manufacturing careers are and how to acquire them. Dream It Do It Nevada has been somewhat successful, primarily in Northern Nevada right now. He informed the Council that the “Dream It Do It Nevada” program has been very successful with getting career pathway information out to high school and community college students, and it’s something that is going to have to continue month-after-month and year-after-year for the foreseeable future.

Mr. Costella requested for Jonathan Begley to touch base on last year’s effort where the “Dream It Do It Nevada” program was able to coordinate an impressive number of teachers coming through the manufacturing facilities as well as coordinating the Right Skills Now Program in partnership with the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation (DETR), Western Nevada College, and Truckee Meadows Community College..

XI. *Presentation and Discussion/Possible Action – Youth Update..... Odalys Carmona

Odalys Carmona introduced herself as the DETR- Workforce Division Unit, Youth Advocate and provided an update to the sector council on the Governor’s Youth website. Ms. Carmona informed the Council that Dr. Martinez will be placing the Governor’s Youth website up in the Washoe County School District, also posting at all the counselor’s office and all the career labs. Ms. Carmona mentioned that the Governor’s Youth website is also up and running with Clark County School District. In addition, the Governor’s Youth Program in currently in the process of talking to the superintendents to schedule a meeting so Director Woodbeck could have an audience with them and present to the other 15 school districts so we can have Governor’s Youth website on their web page as well. The “Movie Theater” message is a message that was developed by the Arsenal Marketing and Director Woodbeck, and this aired in the Reno and Las Vegas area theaters on November 16, and basically, it’s the same message that the Website provides, so we wanted to keep it all the same. She noted that this information also matches with all the marketing materials that we’ll be putting out to the Clark County and Washoe School Districts later on this month. The Governor’s Youth Program is working with Stan Hall for DETR to handle the job bank for the Clark County School District.

Ms. Carmona mentioned that her Administrator and DETR Director Woodbeck will also be talking about how to develop a transition plan on how we get these employers to submit their work orders through the website and that way the Clark County Youth can check on the website for all the listings for seasonal employment. Ms. Carmona stated that she had contacted Regina James at Clark County School District regarding the career fair. She informed the council that there's a cost associated with participation at the large college career fair in September -- August/September at Cashman Field. This will be a 2-3 days event from 9:00 a.m. in the morning until 7:00 p.m., there's a lot of exposure and marketing. This would allow the participants to focus on two types of audience; (1) The Youth and introduce them to what Sector Councils are, what the possibilities of staying in Nevada can give them; (2) It will also give the parents an opportunity to realize the variety accessible careers and available training for those who are interested and/or dislocated workers. Ms. Carmona is currently mentoring at Clark County High School one day a week, through the CCSD Reclaim Your Future Program. The CCSD Reclaim Your Future Mentoring Program is one day a week, one hour, and it goes through the entire school district. Please let Ms. Carmona know if you are interested and she will put you in contact with the CCSD coordinator. So they match you to a young man or woman, and it's a great experience, and they really enjoy it. And all these kids really need that one person that isn't family or anything that really cares about them and checks up on them and that sort of thing. So please, if you have the time, it's a great program to be part of and then, as David stated, the CTE, the entire curriculum will be implemented throughout all the high schools. We have been in direct conversations with Stan Hall and also with Mr. Mike Raponi, and he will be presenting at the Governor's Workforce full Board meeting this month, so please, if you can make it, take a look at that presentation. The curriculum is wonderful. Like they say, they tweak it as we need it, but at least it's something that is standardized and it's credible throughout the state. Ms. Carmona noted that the Governor's Youth Council met in December 2012, they revised the Governor's Strategic Plan which will be called the Youth Council. The revised plan has been approved by Director Woodbeck and Salazar, the current Chair and will be submitted to the Governor's Workforce Investment Board for final approval. Finally, the Governor's Youth Council participated at the CCSD Middle School career fair which Councilwoman Gerri Schroder was there and they had over, 300 participants in attendance. They had some manufacturing participants, information technology, NV Energy and the City of Henderson was there.

Next, Ms. Carmona reminded everyone that there will be an upcoming "I Can Be Program" Career Fair for high schools starting at the Foothill High School in which Al Lopez, Vice-Chair for Information Technology Sector Council will be a participant. Councilwoman Gerri Schroder volunteered to give Scott Muelrath who is the Director of Henderson Chamber of Commerce a call to provide additional information to the Sector Council members. Ms. Carmona confirmed that the Career Readiness Standards are going to be presented on January 13, 2013, at the Governor's Workforce Investment Board at 10:00 a.m.

XII. Second Public Comment Session.....Ryan Costella
Members of the public may now comment on any matter or topic, which is relevant to or within the authority or jurisdiction of the Board. You may comment now even if you commented earlier; however, please do not simply repeat the same comment you previously made. Please clearly state and spell your name. Each comment will be limited to three (3) minutes.

Mr. Costella introduced DETR Director Frank Woodbeck to make a public comment. Director Woodbeck provided an update in regards to the Governor's Workforce Investment Board has been reformed and strengthened to a great degree. Director Woodbeck informed the Council that the first meeting of the new Governor's Workforce Investment Board will be this Thursday, January 10, at 2:00 p.m. This meeting will be conducted via videoconference with Carson City and by teleconference call. The Governor's Workforce Investment Board is now at full strength with a total of 35 members. He noted the GWIB Representatives for the Manufacturing Sector Council will be both Mr. Tim Crowley (Nevada Mining Association President) and Mr. Jim Fleming who is the plant manager for GE in Minden, Nevada. He informed the Council that every industry sector will be represented on the Governor's Workforce Investment Board and we have a very strong representation of the business community as well.

Next, Director Woodbeck commented that in following up on the *“Dream It Do It Nevada”* presentation that Mr. Jonathan Begley (Executive Director) presented to the Council was the first example of a public/private partnership in the State of Nevada. He expressed this being a very important example, because it’s what we would like to replicate across the various industry sectors. Director Woodbeck said that the Manufacturing Sector Council is in the forefront of what will be a movement in the State to really strengthen the manufacturing sector, and actually provide a pipeline of educated trained workers into this industry sector. Director Woodbeck informed everyone that he would like to send an overview of how the Sector Council system is now set up and how the information flows to the Governor’s Workforce Investment Board. He embarked on the fact that all decisions begins here at the Sector Council meetings and forwarded on to the Governor’s Workforce Investment Board; at that particular point are funded for future training initiatives throughout the State. He emphasized, this Board has a very vital role in terms of providing that pipeline of information of what’s necessary; not only to get people re-employed, but to train future workers. Director Woodbeck informed the Council that he had a long discussion with Superintendent Pedro Martinez (Washoe County School District) regarding how we can reach into the High Schools and the Secondary Education System to prepare them for the workforce of the future, as well as those who have already graduated. He noted that there’s a need to have remedial training, as well as retraining those who are unemployed. Therefore, we are looking at the pipeline of workers going directly from the school systems right unto the unemployment ranks; trying to fit the need of the manufacturers in this case to fulfill those particular needs. He noted that a “demand-driven” training system is what we’re setting up here to identify what manufacturers need, what individuals in the medical field need, et cetera, and fulfill those particular demands. Director Woodbeck stated that is the way we will invest the approximately \$30 million that comes into the State for training on an on-going basis.

Director Woodbeck thanked everyone and expressed his sincere appreciation for the leadership. He mentioned; *“it’s going to be, when we look back in December, I think you will find some very fulfilling work and accomplishment that this Sector Council has done.”* Again, thank you and Happy New Year.

Mr. Costella requested for any additional second public comment. Hearing none he moved on to agenda item #XIII.
